**1. Call to Order**

Mayor Parker called the meeting to order at 5:33PM.

**2. The Meeting Will be Continued From the Council Chambers and Reconvened in the Staff Room for Discussion of the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget**

The Council continued the meeting from the Council Chambers and reconvened in the staff room at 5:34PM.

**3. Discussion of Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget**

City Manager Bo Reese explained to the Council that the budget will continue to change before it is brought to Council for a vote in June. The budget discussed is a balanced budget and focuses on new initiatives. Jill Fitzgibbon presented the 2022-2023 budget by starting with the general fund. Fitzgibbon discussed the projected sales tax revenues. Reese explained that there needs to be quarterly discussions regarding the budget. Fitzgibbon reminded the Council that the carryover amount will continue to change until the budget is approved. Reese explained that the sports and recreation coordinator will move to the parks department. The Coleman Theatre will move back to under the CVB along with the addition of a main street division. The police department will add the position of a digital evidence clerk.

There was discussion of infrastructure and streets. Tyler Cline reported on the grants and outside funding that the City has applied for. A list of capital improvement projects was shown.

The Council recessed at 7:14PM.

The meeting continued at 7:34PM.

There was discussion of having a Council/Senior Management retreat to work on strategic plans. There was an update on the parks, splashpad, CVB, and the heritage fest. The consensus was that Amanda Davis should begin to order the supplies for the heritage fest to allow for extra shipping time due to supply chain issues. Kevin Browning reported on upcoming maintenance projects at the Coleman Theatre and the Library.

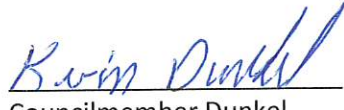
